

#### Introduction

The rules for each Cup or Trophy awarded each year by the Rock Sailing and Water Ski Club are contained in these instructions, as agreed by the Sailing Committee. Water Ski events are not covered in this document.

<u>Scottish Handicap</u>: The Club uses the term, "Scottish Handicap" which has different meanings for different people. It is usually used to mean a "Staggered Start" to a race where a large, mixed fleet is racing – allowing groups of craft to start at slightly different times to avoid overcrowding on the start line. The ensuing race follows the RYA "Average Lap Time Racing" system in which slower classes may be finished early to avoid extending the race time unnecessarily, and ensuring that all competitors sail in approximately the same conditions.

Races with and without Cups or Trophies: Not all races or series on the annual calendar of the Club have cups or trophies associated with them. Some may (or may not) have a prize which may (or may not) count towards overall or annual cups. See later text for details.

**Terminology:** The term "helm" refers to male or female helms.

<u>Temporary membership</u> is available for certain non-open races for a fee. It should be noted that temporary members are not eligible to win cups, trophies or prizes

The racing calendar in any given year will depend on tidal regimes and when public holidays occur.

# **Cup and Trophy Rules**

These Cup and Trophy Rules should be read with **The (ISAF/RYA) Racing Rules of Sailing 2013- 2016 including the RYA Prescriptions** for general guidance, and the current **Portsmouth Yardstick Scheme**, but the RSWSC Sailing Committee will rule on where variations will be used. In addition, the **Sailing Instructions** of the Club must be observed for the awards to be valid.

**Types of racing:** These are based on RYA Rules and the latest Portsmouth Yardstick Scheme):

- Level Racing not Timed (for single class races)
- RYA Average Lap Time Racing (for mixed fleets)
- Pursuit Races (RYA Pursuit Numbers for 2 hours)

Qualifying craft: Any craft that is to be considered for any Cups or Trophies must be of a type

recognised by the RYA. Where the craft is to compete in mixed fleets (Average lap time racing) or in Pursuit Races, it is required to have a Portsmouth Yardstick Number (handicap). The Sailing Committee has the right to assign a Trial or Club PY number to a non-standard boat. Certain Development Classes may be assigned a Club PY depending on age as agreed by the relevant class associations, but such numbers

must be ratified by the Sailing Committee.

**Qualifying races:** A race is a scheduled event in the Club sailing programme which takes place and in

which there are a minimum of 3 (three) boats which cross the start line. Where there are fewer starters, or where the race is abandoned or cancelled, the race will be considered void. For an individual race to count towards a series, it must not be void.

**Nos. of discards:** 7 to 9 qualifying races in series 2 discards

4 to 6 qualifying races in series 1 discard 2 or 3 qualifying races in series 1 discard

However, in both Peter Keeling Week and Camel Week, there will be only one discard. Other exceptions are at the discretion of the Sailing Committee.

<u>Ties:</u> Ties will be decided as per the Sailing Instructions.

<u>Craft types:</u> Monohulls (excluding Shrimpers); multihulls (usually but not exclusively catamarans or

twin hulled craft); and Shrimpers. Non-standard craft may be assigned to a category

by the Sailing Committee.

Age qualification: Throughout these rules, all reference to age qualification relates to the person's age

on 1<sup>st</sup> September of the current year.

Handling of Awards: Cups or Trophies won may only be taken home by Full or Family or Associate

Members of the Club. This means that an award won by an entrant in an Open Event who is not a Full or Family or Associate Member of the Club, will be presented the Award, but it will be kept in the Trophy Cabinet at the Club and may not be taken home. Winners of awards are expected to have their name(s) engraved on the award in the same style as earlier years, at their own expense. For awards won by non-members, the Club will arrange engraving, at the Club's expense. All Cups and Trophies must be returned to the Club well in advance of the race(s) for which they

were given the previous year.

**Distribution of Trophies:** The distribution of trophies and prizes will be as follows:

3 to 5 entries 1st place only
6 to 10 entries 1st and 2nd places
11 to 15 entries 1st, 2nd and 3rd places

Over 15 entries Square root number of entries + 1

#### OVERALL/ANNUAL CUPS/TROPHIES

#### THE DUCHY OF CORNWALL CUP

Awarded to/for: This award is for the monohull and multihull fleets only (ie Shrimper fleet

excluded) and is made to the winning helm with the best 8 results (or fewer at the discretion of the Sailing Committee) over the season. One race is to

count outside July and August.

Eligibility: Full members only

Qualifying Races: Easter Chase (4); Dinghy Spring Series (13)

Spring Cup (3); Dinghy Autumn Series (8) Dinghy Series 1, 2, 3 & 4 (4, 7, 5 and 3)

Estuary + Pyne Trophies (1 + 1); Challenge Cups (1)

September Brea Buoy (2); Westerly Cup (3)

Comments: Discriminatory races which are not included are: Ladies' Race; Adrian

Hooper Cups (both original and new); Ancient Mariners' Cup; Grandparents'

Cup; and all Camel Week and other Club Open events.

#### THE JOYCE LANE CUP

Awarded to/for: This award is for the monohull and multihull fleets only (ie Shrimper fleet

excluded) and is made to the winning helm under 18 years of age, with the best 8 results (or fewer at the discretion of the Sailing Committee) over the

season. One race is to count outside July and August.

Eligibility: Full, family or associate members only

Qualifying Races: Easter Chase (4); Dinghy Spring Series (13)

Spring Cup (3); Dinghy Autumn Series (8) Dinghy Series 1, 2, 3 & 4 (4, 7, 5 and 3)

Estuary + Pyne Trophies (1 + 1); Challenge Cups (1)

September Brea Buoy (2); Westerly Cup (3)

Comments: Discriminatory races which are not included are: Ladies' Race; Adrian

Hooper Cups (both original and new); Ancient Mariners' Cup; Grandparents'

Cup; and all Camel Week and Club Open events.

#### THE KELLY MEMORIAL CUP

Awarded to/for: This award is for the Shrimper fleet only, and is made to the winning helm

with the best 12 results (or fewer at the discretion of the Sailing Committee)

over the season. However, Camel Week Races are not included.

Eligibility: Full members only

Qualifying Races: Peter Keeling Trophy (6)

Angus Scott Trophy (3) Series A, B and D (7, 9 and 7)

Comments: These races are undertaken on a one-class basis with no differentiation

being made between Shrimpers with an in-board engine and those with an

outboard motor. For those with an outboard motor, it is required to be

carried on board.

#### ONE-CLASS OPEN MEETINGS AND EARLY RACES

#### THE BOWDEN LASER TROPHY

Awarded to/for: Awarded by a member of the Bowden Family to the helm with the best

aggregate result over the series of 4 races.

Eligibility: Open

Qualifying Races: Laser Open (4)

Comments: This series takes place over the Easter Bank Holiday weekend.

Other prizes subject to numbers of entries.

#### THE EASTER CHASE TROPHY

Awarded to/for: Awarded by a member of the Hough family, to the winning helm with the

best aggregate result over the series of 4 scheduled races.

Eligibility: Series is Open.

Qualifying Races: Easter Chase Series (4)

Comments: This series takes place over the Easter Bank Holiday weekend and is open

to any craft with a valid PY number, helmed by a full or temporary member

of the Sailing Club.

Other prizes subject to numbers of entries.

#### THE LARK SILVER SALVER

Awarded to/for: Awarded to the winning helm with the best aggregate result over the series

of 6 scheduled races, raced on three consecutive days.

Eligibility: Open

Qualifying Races: Lark Open (6)

Comments: This series takes place over the first Spring Bank Holiday weekend.

Other prizes subject to numbers of entries.

#### THE SPRING CUP

Awarded to/for: Awarded to the winning helm with the best aggregate result over the series

of 3 scheduled races

Eligibility: Members or Associate Members only

Qualifying Races: Spring Cup Series (3)

Comments: This series takes place over the late May Bank Holiday weekend for any

craft with a valid PY number, helmed by a member of the Sailing Club.

Other prizes subject to numbers of entries.

#### PETER KEELING SHRIMPER WEEK

Peter Keeling Shrimper Week is an open event, comprising six planned races, and one informal race.

#### THE PETER KEELING TROPHY

Awarded to/for: Awarded to the winning helm and crew with the best aggregate result over

Shrimper Week.

Qualifying Races: Peter Keeling Shrimper Week (6)

Comments: The number of discards for the series will be 1 (one) irrespective of whether

6 races take place, or 5, or 4. If only 3 races take place (or 2), all will count.

The series will be void only if fewer than 2 races take place.

Other prizes subject to number of entries

#### THE ROBERTSON PROPELLER

Awarded to/for: Awarded to the helm and crew of the leading in-board powered Shrimper

during Peter Keeling Week.

Qualifying Races: Peter Keeling Shrimper Week (6)

Comments: The number of discards for the series will be 1 (one) irrespective of whether

6 races take place, or 5, or 4. If only 3 races take place (or 2), all will count.

The series will be void only if fewer than 2 races take place.

Other prizes subject to numbers of entries.

#### THE GREAVES ROWLOCKS

Awarded to/for: An Award entirely at the discretion of the Race Officer.

Qualifying Races: Peter Keeling Shrimper Week (6)

Comments: This award is to recognise something for which there is no other form of

recognition.

#### THE QUAYSIDE SHRIMPER CHALLENGE SHIELD

Awarded to/for: Awarded to the winning helm and crew of the participating Shrimper fleet

for the Waders Race.

Eligibility: An open event for Shrimpers
Qualifying Race: The Wadebridge Race (1)

Comments: This is a race which takes place during the Peter Keeling Shrimper

Week but which does not count towards the series. The race only takes place going up to what was the Waders Restaurant in Wadebridge; now renamed The Hub. This race could perhaps be known as The Hubbub since the OED defines hubbub as 'A confused noise of a crowd shouting or talking; the shouting of a war cry; noisy turmoil; a row' - which aptly describes a collective of Shrimper owners.

#### JUNIOR CAMEL WEEK

Junior Camel Week is an Open week for helms between the ages of 8 and 17 years on 1<sup>st</sup> September of the current year; for monohulls between Portsmouth yardstick Numbers 987 and 1649; or for craft at the discretion of the Race Officer with the concurrence of the Sailing Committee.

During the week, 5 races are scheduled. If four or five races are sailed, there will be one discard; if three races are sailed, all will count; and if fewer than three races are sailed, the series will be void. Ties will be decided as per the Sailing Instructions of the Club.

There are a variety of awards available, but competitors' attention is drawn to the section on "Handling of Awards", Cup and Trophy Rules, earlier. Race results all count towards series points, irrespective of age.

#### Cornish Holidays Cup

Eligibility: Helm and crew between ages of 8 and 17 years

Fleet: Monohulls, PY 987-1649

Details: The Cornish Holidays Cup is awarded to the winning helm and crew of the Race

of this name, and is presented by John Bray and Partners.

Junior Goblets

Eligibility: Helm must be under the age of 15 years

Fleet: Monohulls, PY 987-1649, helm/crew aged between 8 and 15 yrs

Details: The Junior Goblets Cup is awarded to the leading helm and crew less than 15 years

of age in this race. No separate cup or trophy is awarded to the winner of the race if 15 years or over, but results count toward series points.

Bubbles Trophy

Eligibility: Toppers only, helm between age 8 and 17 years

Fleet: Helm between ages 8 and 17 yrs

Details: The Bubbles Trophy is presented by the Greaves family to the highest placed

Topper in the overall results for the week.

Junior Cup

Eligibility: Helm must be between 15 and 17 years of age, crew less than 17 yrs

Fleet: Monohulls, PY 987-1649, helm/crew less than 17 yrs

Details: The Junior Cup is presented to the winning helm between 15 and 17 yrs, with

crew less than 17 yrs, in this race.

Vicuna Cup

Eligibility: Helm and crew must be between ages 8 and 17

Fleet: Monohulls, PY 987-1649

Details: The Vicuna Cup is awarded to the winning helm and crew of this race, which is

presented by Dave Parr.

Hendraburnick Cup

Eligibility: Helm and crew must be between ages 8 and 17

Fleet: Monohulls, PY 987-1649

Details: The Hendraburnick Cup is awarded to the winning helm and crew for the

week's races, who must also have taken part in the Swallows and Amazons

competition, and is presented by the Regan family.

**Gull Trophy** 

Eligibility: Helm and crew must be between ages 8 and 15

Fleet: Monohulls, PY 987-1649

Details: The Gull Trophy is awarded to the helm and crew under the age of 15, with

the best aggregate score for the series, and was donated by Ian Proctor.

Denis Hapgood Trophy

Eligibility: Laser, helm/crew aged between 8 and 17

Fleet: Originally for Mirror 10s, but now for any Lasers including Picos

Details: Awarded to the helm of any Laser with the best aggregate score in the series

providing there have been at least two Lasers starting in each race in the series.

The trophy is awarded by the Hapgood family.

Rio Rita Cup

Eligibility: Topper, helm between ages 8 and 17

Fleet: Not applicable

Details: The Rio Rita Cup is awarded to the highest placed Topper helm in the series

and is presented by the Hapgood family.

Dyas Cup

Eligibility: Female helm, aged between 8 and 17 years

Fleet: Monohulls, PY 987-1649

Details: The Dyas Cup is awarded to the most deserving female helm in the series, to

recognise tenacity, endeavour, selflessness or the like; is awarded by the Race

Officer, and is presented by the Dyas sisters.

Endeavour 2000 Trophy

Eligibility: Helm between ages 8 and 17 Fleet: Monohulls, PY 987-1649

Details: The Endeavour 2000 Trophy is awarded by the Race Officer to the most

deserving young helm of the series not to have won a trophy.

Samson Deane Cup

Eligibility: Helm between ages 8 and 17 Fleet: Monohulls, PY 987-1649

Details: This cup is awarded by Lizzie Deane for the helm placed 10<sup>th</sup> from last in

the Junior Camel Week Series, in recognition that being in the middle of the fleet

can be a good thing.

Junior Camel Week Champion Novice Trophy

Eligibility: Novice (not raced in Junior Camel Week before)

Fleet: Monohulls, PY 987-1649

Details: The JCW Champion Novice Trophy is awarded to the highest placed novice

in the series, and is presented by Patrick Windeler.

CEYS Trophy (Formerly the SW Travellers' Trophy)

Eligibility: CEYS trained Members only Fleet: Monohulls, PY 987-1649

Details: The salver was originally donated by the Hough family as the SW Travellers' Trophy

but was never awarded. It has been reassigned as The CEYS Trophy in

recognition of the important part that CEYS plays in sailing in The Camel Estuary and is awarded to the highest placed CEYS helm during Junior Camel Week trained through the CEYS System. It is presented by a member of the Hough family.

Swallows and Amazons Competition

Eligibility: Teams as specified by the Junior Committee

Fleet: Monohulls, PY 987-1649

Details: The Swallows and Amazons award is made to the winning team in the competition.

Teams of two boats compete in the following events – or similar ones:

1. Capsize drills

2. Relay Race across the estuary

3. Ferry Race using a single boat4. Man overboard pickup relay race

5. Any other events approved by the Sailing Committee

Sue Hudson Memorial Cup

Eligibility: CEYS trained Members only Fleet: Monohull, PY 987 - 1649

Details: The Sue Hudson Memorial Cup is awarded to the highest overall placed girl Junior

Member helm in Junior Camel Week trained through the CEYS system.

Camel Sailing School Trophy

Eligibility: CEYS trained members only Fleet: Monohull, PY 987 - 1649

Details: The highest placed Junior Member crew in Junior Camel Week graduated through

the CEYS system in the current year.

#### CAMEL WEEK

Camel Week is the major sailing event of the Rock Sailing and Water Ski Calendar, usually occurring at the most appropriate tidal regime in mid-August, namely during the Neap Tides period. It normally attracts a large, mixed fleet. There are many awards made during the week and thus the listing of all cups, trophies and other awards is presented by category below, for ease of reference.

The Week provides a series of open handicap events (except Shrimpers), over 6 days, weather permitting. Because of the size of the combined fleet, and to achieve manageable numbers for each start, the ultra-fast Monohulls start together with the Multihulls (PY 0-1010); the rest of the Monohull fleet is separated into fast (PY 1011-1230) and slow (PY 1231-1649) groups; and Shrimpers sail separate courses and have their own Race Officer. See the Sailing Instructions for multiple starts to the same race. Depending on conditions, racing may take place in the estuary or outside in the Padstow/Hayle Bay off Polzeath at the discretion of the Race Officer.

# CAMEL WEEK (Combined Monohull and Multihull Fleets)

#### Renovation Trophy - Pursuit

Details: The Renovation Trophy is awarded to the winning helm and crew of the pursuit

race of the same name.

Commodore's Cup - Pursuit

Details: The Commodore's Cup is awarded to the winning helm and crew of the pursuit

race of the same name.

Master Mariner:

Eligibility: Helm to be over 50 years of age but < 65 yrs on 1<sup>st</sup> September.

Details: The Master Mariner is the qualifying helm of the winning boat on handicap over

the week, who is over 50 years of age. No cup or trophy is presented, but a

prize is given.

Grand Master Mariner

Eligibility: Helm to be over 65 years of age on 1<sup>st</sup> September.

Details: The Grand Master Mariner is the qualifying helm of the winning boat on

handicap over the week, who is over 65 years of age. No cup or trophy is

presented, but a prize is given.

David Lester Memorial Cup

Details:

Eligibility: Helm (and crew) to be a full member, each under 25 years of age (On Sept 1)

This Cup is awarded to the qualifying helm (and crew) that is placed highest in

Camel Week.

Firrell Trophy

Eligibility: Helm (and crew) to be Full/Family/Student/Associate member < 18 yrs of age

Details: The Firrell Trophy is awarded to the qualifying helm (and crew) achieving the

best result in the two pursuit races in Camel Week (Renovation Trophy Race and the Commodore's Cup Race). A tie will be decided by the prescribed

method laid down in the Sailing Instructions.

Robina Arthur Memorial Trophy

Eligibility: Helm to be female

Details: The Robina Arthur Memorial Trophy is awarded to the winning female helm in

the Camel Week series.

Camel's Hump

Details: The Camel's Hump is awarded to the helm (and crew) placed mid-way in the

Camel Week series.

Camel's Tail

Details: The Camel's Tail is awarded to the helm (and crew) in the lowest position that

has completed all the series races.

**Gusty Family Trophy** 

Details: The Gusty Family Trophy is awarded to the best placed monohull with two

Generations crewing the boat in the series. One person must be under the age

of eighteen on 1st September of the current year.

# CAMEL WEEK (Monohulls only)

Brea Buoy Cup

Details: The Brea Buoy Cup is awarded to the winning helm (and crew) of the race of the

same name, the course should include Brea Buoy

Porthilly Cup

Details: The Porthilly Cup is awarded to the winning helm (and crew) of the race of the

same name, the course should include Rounding.

Gentle Jane Cup

Details: The Gentle Jane Cup is awarded to the winning helm (and crew) of the race of

the same name, the course should include Gentle Jane.

Rock Trophy

Details: The Rock Trophy is awarded to the winning helm (and crew) of the race of the

same name, the course should include "Rock" (formerly "Ferry") \*\*\*.

Camel Trophy

Details: The Camel Trophy is awarded to the winning monohull helm (and crew) of the

series on handicap.

# CAMEL WEEK (Multihulls only)

Dinham Trophy

Details: The Dinham Trophy is awarded to the winning helm (and crew) of the race of

this name.

Rush High Flier Trophy

Details: The Rush High Flier Trophy is awarded to the winning helm (and crew) of the

race of the same name.

Chisholm Cup

Details: The Chisholm Cup is awarded to the winning helm (and crew) of the race of the

same name.

Camel Silver Salver

Details: The Camel Silver Salver is awarded to the winning helm (and crew) of the race

of the same name.

Gunn Cup

Details: The Gunn Cup is awarded to the winning helm (and crew) of the series.

# CAMEL WEEK (Other Cups/Trophies or Awards – excepting Shrimpers)

There are a number of awards made to winners of specific classes of boat over the whole Camel Week series, but these will only be awarded where there have been at least four eligible starters in the respective classes. They are listed as follows:

Eligibility: Open

Awards: C, T & O Burgee Trophies (PY 0-1010; PY 1011-1230; PY 1231-1649)

Asymmetric Class Cup (Asymmetric, PY 0-900) Osprey Cup (Asymmetric, PY 901-1022) THUG Cup (Two-handed, unaided Genneker)

#### Round the Island Race

Eligibility: Full and temporary members only Fleet: Mixed, below PY 1100 only

Details: This is an informal race which takes place on the last day of Camel Week, weather and conditions permitting. It was originally proposed by Jums Greaves as a means of recovering from the festivities of Prize-Giving. The conditions

under which it takes place are:

1. Weather permitting (Race Officer to decide on the day in consultation with the committee as appropriate.)

- 2. Le Mans start at Ferry Point at low tide, with the helms starting with their backs to the sea wall. Crew or helpers for single-handers, hold their boats into the beach.
- 3. The race is to a mark on the far side of Newlands Rock with the finishing line being a flag on land at Ferry Point, seaward of the Ferry landing (and at the position of the Race Officer's desk) with a floating racing mark in transit roughly in line with Padstow Point about 200 yards offshore.
- 4. The One-Hour Rule: If a craft has not reached the buoy beyond Newlands Rock within the hour from the start, it must turn back.
- 5. The winner is first past the post (ie no handicap)

# CAMEL WEEK (Shrimper Fleet)

David Suter Eclipse Trophy

Details: Awarded to the winner of the Shrimper Camel Week Series.

Parker Trophy

Details: Awarded to the winner of the race of this name.

Francis Cup

Details: Awarded to the winner of the race of this name.

Red Buoy Cup

Details: Awarded to the winner of the race of this name.

John Lees Memorial Cup

Details: Awarded to the winner of the race of this name, but the combined age of helm

and crew must exceed 120 yrs. It is presented by Sheelagh Lees.

Cibie Cup

Details: Awarded to the winning in-board engined Shrimper in the race of this name.

St Minver (Perpetual) Cup

Details: Awarded to the helm (and crew) participating in the St Minver Cup Race, who

has not previously won a race in this Camel Week.

Robertson Cup

Details: Awarded to the helm (and crew) of the runner-up Shrimper in Camel Week.

# OTHER MIXED FLEET RACES (Including Multihulls)

A number of races are run at other times which depend on the dates of holidays and tidal regimes. Thus, in some years, some of these races will take place before Camel Week, and in other years, after it. Details will be published in the Programme, in News Letters or on the Club website. They are simply listed together to avoid having to rewrite these rules every year to suit the programme.

#### Challenge Cups - C, T, O, Wayfarer and Enterprise Classes & Osprey Cup

Eligibility: Full or temporary member Fleet: "C-Class" - PY 0 – 1010

"T-Class" - PY 1011 – 1230 "O-Class" - PY 1231 – 1649

THUG Boat Challenge Cup – 2-handed, unaided, Genneker

Osprev Cup - Asymmetric classes PY 901 - 1022

Details: All classes compete on handicap in this one race, cups and trophies being

awarded to the winning helm/crew in each class. However, for a cup or trophy to be awarded, there must have been at least four (4) starters in each respective

class.

Adrian Hooper Cup

Eligibility: Full and Temporary members only, single handed in a 2- or more-crewed boat Details: Awarded for this one race, to the winning helm on handicap sailing single-

Awarded for this one race, to the winning helm on handicap sailing single-handed a class of boat, which normally carries a crew of two, notwithstanding any directions to the contrary in the individual class rules. There will be no variation in the PY number based on the omission of crew normally carried.

New Adrian Hooper Cup

Eligibility: Full/Temp/Associate members only, single handed in a single-handed boat Details: Awarded for this one race, to the winning helm on handicap sailing single-

Awarded for this one race, to the winning helm on handicap sailing single-handed a class of boat which the class rules categorise as single-handed.

Pyne Trophy

Eligibility: Full, Temporary or Associate Members only

Details: The Pyne Trophy is awarded to the winner of a single, massed start, handicap

race. The course: The Club start line employs the inner distance mark as the starboard passing mark AND the outer distance mark as the port passing mark – or *vice versa* – which means that competitors return to the gate after every mark passing either the inner or outer distance marks to port or starboard. This avoids boats approaching the inner distance mark from opposite directions.

Ancient Mariners' Cup

Details:

Eligibility: Full/temporary members only; helm >50 years and combined helm+crew >100

Special Rule for this race: A time adjustment will be made by deducting 10 seconds from the elapsed time for each year in excess of 100, before

corrections are applied. The Ancient Mariners' Cup is awarded to the winning

helm and crew on adjusted time and handicap.

Grandparents' Cup

Eligibility: Both helm and crew must be full members. See details below.

Details: The Grandparents' Cup is awarded to the winning helm on handicap in this

single race. Both helm and crew must be grandparents but not necessarily

related to each other.

The Estuary Trophy

Eligibility: Full, Temporary or Associate Members only

Details: The Estuary Trophy is awarded to the winner on handicap of this single race. If

weather conditions permit, the course should include Cant, Tregonce, and a buoy

near Gun Point.

Ladies' Challenge Bowl

Eligibility: Ladies only, Full or Temporary Members in their own right or as family members.

The crew may be male.

Details: Awarded to the winning lady helm on handicap in this race.

If there are three or more entries with all lady crews there will be an additional

award.

Westerly Cup

Eligibility: Full, Temporary or Associate members only

Details: Awarded to the winning helm on handicap for the series of three races run over

the August Bank Holiday weekend.

September Brea Buoy Cup

Eligibility: Full, Temporary or Associate members only

Details: A series of two races in September, which must include Brea Buoy \*\*\* as one of

the marks on the course. The Cup is awarded to the winner on handicap who

may NOT be the winner of the Brea Buoy Cup of the same year.

#### OTHER SHRIMPER RACES

Potted Shrimper

Eligibility: Members only

Details: Awarded to the helm and crew of the winning Shrimper in this race, which is

usually sailed on the same day as the Challenge Cups. This trophy was

originally the GP-14 Challenge Cup; but the replacement has been renamed and

the current trophy was both made and donated by Jackie Hall.

**Angus Scott Trophy** 

Eligibility: Members only

Details: Awarded to the winner of a series of 3 races run during the August Bank-Holiday

weekend. This series was originally for dayboats but is now exclusively for

Shrimpers.
